In Monday's mail, I received from the Catholic Foundation a check for \$6,000.00. You may recall that the parish applied last year for a grant to purchase equipment for use in our sacramental preparation programs. We purchased a large screen television, a blue ray player, a sound bar, several round tables (it is much easier for groups to converse together at a round table), and programs for RCIA, baptismal catechesis, conformation preparation, etc. The check the parish just received reimburses us for these expenditures. The Foundation has been generous to our community many times. I think I speak for everyone when I say how grateful we are.
