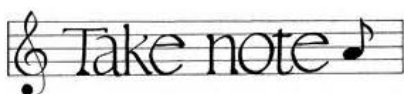

Why are the RCIA participants dismissed in the middle of the Mass?

On Sundays, beginning in Advent, our adult catechumens or candidates participating in the RCIA process are dismissed at the end of the Liturgy of the Word. This will continue each Sunday until Easter when, at the Easter Vigil, those who are ready will join us at the Table of the Eucharist for the first time. The parish is not sending them out because they are somehow “unworthy” to stay for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Though they cannot yet come to the table of the Eucharist, Mother Church still has an obligation to feed those who have entered into a relationship with her through the Rites of Acceptance, which happen on the first Sunday of Advent.

God’s Word is their primary food during this period. Instead of remaining for the Liturgy of the Eucharist, the participants depart from the Mass with one or more RCIA team members to discuss the Mass readings for that Sunday and to experience more fully the impact of the Scriptures in their lives. This time is known as “Breaking Open the Word.” Through the dismissal to Break Open the Word, the parish community is invited to pray for the catechumens and candidates, and in return the catechumens or candidates experience a sense of belonging to a community that cares for them. Please feel free to introduce yourself to our catechumens or candidates and offer your assistance in their faith journey.

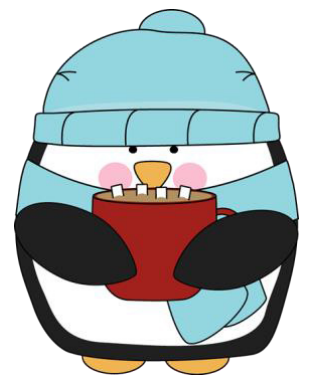

Sharing Our Blessings



As Thanksgiving and Christmas approach, many people consider how they can share with the less fortunate the blessings God has given us. One marvelous program which we have employed at Our Lady of Peace for years is the Giving Tree. St. Francis Outreach Center in McArthur, Ohio, establishes a store for needy families and allows invited guests to select donated gifts for their families. At OLP we put up trees in the gathering space and deck them with tags, on each of which is printed the name

of a specific gift or the gender and age of the recipient. Parishioners pluck tags from the trees, purchase the appropriate gifts, and bring the gifts back to the gathering space so that Santa's helpers can take them to the Outreach Center. If you have not participated in this program before, you might consider doing so this year.

Another program with which we will experiment this year is the "Holiday Ask Campaign" sponsored by the Family Mentor Foundation. The foundation provides meals for children who qualify for free or reduced lunches during the school year. Of course, the children don't get the lunches when school is not in session; and not even Scrooge wants a child to go hungry. After the Giving Tree tags have disappeared and the gifts for McArthur have gone south on Santa's sleigh, we shall deck the trees with other tags giving information about the program and asking for donations.
