
Thanks to John Umpleby and volunteers again for another successful blood drive, especially needed during the Summer months.

**St. Peter
Julian
Eymard
Priest
1811-1868
August 2**



Born in La Mure d'Isère in

southeastern

France, Peter Julian's faith journey drew him from being a priest in the Diocese of Grenoble (1834) to joining the Marists (1839) to founding the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament (1856).

In addition to those changes, Peter Julian coped with poverty, his father's initial opposition to Peter's vocation, serious illness, a Jansenistic overemphasis on sin and the difficulties of getting diocesan and later papal approval for his new religious community.

His years as a Marist, including service as a provincial leader, saw the deepening of his Eucharistic devotion, especially through his preaching of Forty Hours in many parishes.


Inspired at first by the idea of reparation for indifference to the Eucharist, Peter Julian was eventually attracted to a more positive spirituality of Christ-centered love. Members of the men's community, which Peter founded, alternated between an active apostolic life and contemplating Jesus in the Eucharist. He and Marguerite Guillot founded the women's

Congregation of the Servants of the Blessed Sacrament.

Peter Julian Eymard was beatified in 1925 and canonized in 1962.

Quote

“The Eucharist is the life of the people. The Eucharist gives them a center of life. All can come together without the barriers of race or language in order to celebrate the feast days of the Church. It gives them a law of life, that of charity, of which it is the source; thus it forges between them a common bond, a Christian kinship” (Peter Julian Eymard).



Catholic History Timeline



596 – Pope St. Gregory I sent St. Augustine of Canterbury and 40 monks to do missionary work in England.

597 – St. Columba died. He founded an important monastery at Iona, established schools and did notable missionary work in Scotland. By the end of the century, monasteries of nuns were common; Western monasticism was flourishing; monasticism in the East, under the influence of Monophysitism and other factors, was losing its vigor.

613 – St. Columban established the influential monastery of Bobbio in northern Italy; he died there in 615.

628 – Heraclius, Eastern Emperor, recovered the True Cross from the Persians.

649 – A Lateran council condemned two erroneous formulas (Ecthesis and Type) issued by emperors Heraclius and Constans II as means of

reconciling Monophysites with the Church.

664 – Actions of the Synod of Whitby advanced the adoption of Roman usages in England.

680-81 – Ecumenical Council of Constantinople (III). It condemned Monothelism, which held that Christ had only one will, the divine.

At the end of World War I, the **Knights of Columbus** provided post cards (above) to soldiers returning from overseas to advise their families that they were back on US soil. For security reasons they could not tell them where, but knowing they were “safe and sound in the good old U.S.A.” was comfort enough.
