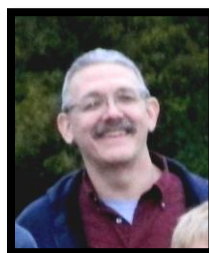

I hope you have signed up for the Alpha program the parish is offering. While it is not sponsored by the Knights it is a worthy program that all should attend and support.

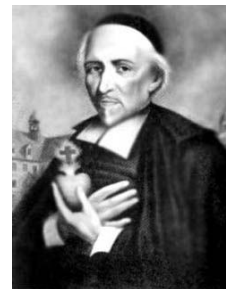

**Saint John
Eudes
Religious
Founder
1601-1680
August 19**



Born on a farm in northern France, John died at 79 in the next "county" or department. In that time he was a religious, a parish missionary, founder of two religious communities and a great promoter of the devotion to the Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

He joined the religious community of the Oratorians and was ordained a priest at 24. During severe plagues in 1627 and 1631, he volunteered to care for the stricken in his own diocese. Lest he infect his fellow religious, he lived in a huge cask in the middle of a field during the plague.

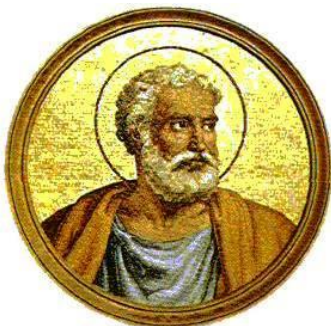
At age 32, John became a parish missionary. His gifts as preacher and confessor won him great popularity. He preached over 100 parish missions, some lasting from several weeks to several months.

In his concern with the spiritual improvement of the clergy, he realized that the greatest need was for seminaries. He had permission from his general superior, the bishop and even Cardinal Richelieu to begin this work, but the succeeding general superior disapproved. After prayer and counsel, John decided it was best to leave the religious community. The same year he

founded a new one, ultimately called the Eudists (Congregation of Jesus and Mary), devoted to the formation of the clergy by conducting diocesan seminaries. The new venture, while approved by individual bishops, met with immediate opposition, especially from Jansenists and some of his former associates. John founded several seminaries in Normandy, but was unable to get approval from Rome (partly, it was said, because he did not use the most tactful approach).

In his parish mission work, John was disturbed by the sad condition of prostitutes who sought to escape their miserable life. Temporary shelters were found but arrangements were not satisfactory. A certain Madeleine Lamy, who had cared for several of the women, one day said to him, "Where are you off to now? To some church, I suppose, where you'll gaze at the images and think yourself pious. And all the time what is really wanted of you is a decent house for these poor creatures." The words, and the laughter of those present, struck deeply within him. The result was another new religious community, called the Sisters of Charity of the Refuge.

He is probably best known for the central theme of his writings: Jesus as the source of holiness, Mary as the model of the Christian life. John's devotion to the Sacred Heart and to the Immaculate Heart of Mary led Pius XI to declare him the father of the liturgical cult of the Hearts of Jesus and Mary.

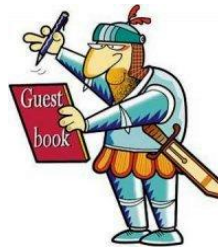
The program will inspire men to find strength in faith and love to become men of authentic courage, compassion, and integrity!

Catholic History Timeline



May 6, 1527: Sack of Rome

1531: Our Lady of Guadalupe appears to Juan Diego in Mexico.

November 16, 1532: Francisco Pizarro captures Alahualpa. Conquest of the Incan Empire.

August 15, 1534: Saint Ignatius of Loyola and six others, including Francis Xavier met in Montmartre, then just outside Paris, to found the missionary Jesuit Order.

October 30, 1534: English Parliament passes Act of Supremacy making the King of England Supreme Head of the Church of England. Anglican schism with Rome.

1535: Michelangelo painting the Last Judgment in the Sistine Chapel.

1536 To 1540: Dissolution of the Monasteries in England, Wales and Ireland.

December 17, 1538: Pope Paul III excommunicates King Henry VIII of England.

1540: Pope Paul III confirmed the order of the Society of Jesus.

July 21, 1542: Pope Paul III, with the Constitution *Licet ab initio*, established the Supreme Sacred Congregation of the Roman and Universal Inquisition.

Bishop John Ambrose Watterson



Bishop John Ambrose Watterson, the second bishop of Columbus, was

consecrated on **Sunday, August 8, 1880** at St. Joseph’s Cathedral.

He received his Episcopal consecration from Archbishop William Henry Elder, Coadjutor to the Archbishop of Cincinnati, assisted by Bishop William McCloskey of Louisville and Bishop John Tuigg of Pittsburgh.

Over 12,000 people came to Columbus from around the Diocese and state to attend the consecration. The grand procession after the consecration was over a mile and a half in length and the parade route the many Catholic Societies and bands took through downtown Columbus was in excess of 5 miles.

He served as Bishop of Columbus from 1880 until his death in 1899.
