## Winter Mission Reflection

Working with the Run the Race Center to give a child a new bedroom was a new experience for me, I'll admit that. It was my first mission trip, not counting the few visits I've made to assist at the Van Buren Center, helping to serve dinner to those in need. However, those visits only lasted a few hours, and this trip lasted two full days and nights. Just going into it, I knew it would be very different from what I was used to.



When I first arrived, I felt distant from the youth of other parishes, as I hadn't spoken with the majority of them before, and I felt a bit awkward. Throughout the weekend, as I allowed myself to get to know the people around me, I came to realize that this was one of the most loving, welcoming groups I had ever happened upon. Everyone quickly learned my name, spoke to me during down time, and assisted me in any work necessary. It was such a

kind, hard-working group of people. I am so glad that I met them and had the chance to work with them.

While I did have plenty of time to get to know the group, it was our work, not our social time, that was prevalent throughout the weekend. The volunteers from OLP all worked together to redecorate the room of a young girl named Raymah. When we first arrived at the house, Raymah was still asleep, but before long she was dressed and helping us move her furniture and paint her bedroom her favorite color. Her rambunctiousness was endearing, although at times distracting, and her happy chatter about Christmas plans and family and her future room made the work fun, and time passed quickly.

On our second day, we didn't let Raymah work with us as much, because we wanted to surprise her with her new room. When we were finished, and Raymah had been invited back in to enjoy her new room, we all sat together and did a craft, and then painted nails with some of the new polishes we had gotten her. What struck me about Raymah was her kindness, and her polite attitude. She was always respectful to us, never rude or unheeding in her excitement to help create her new room. She never grew exasperated when we didn't understand her. And when it was all done, she shared her craft, which she had received as a Christmas present, with us. She gave so much of her time and love to us, even as we were commandeering her room and invading her personal space.



This mission allowed me to find a community that I love. A community of youth rich in affection, a community I am proud to be a part of, and a community I want to help to grow. I had a wonderful time on the trip, and look forward to going on more missions in the future, and spreading the positivity.
